



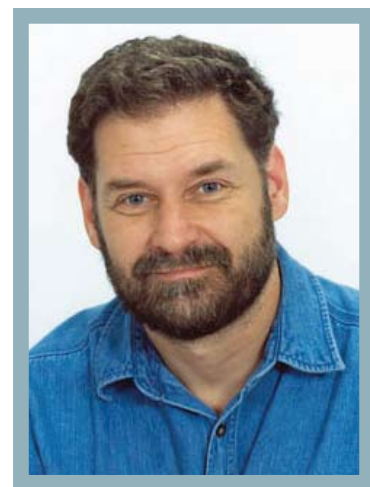

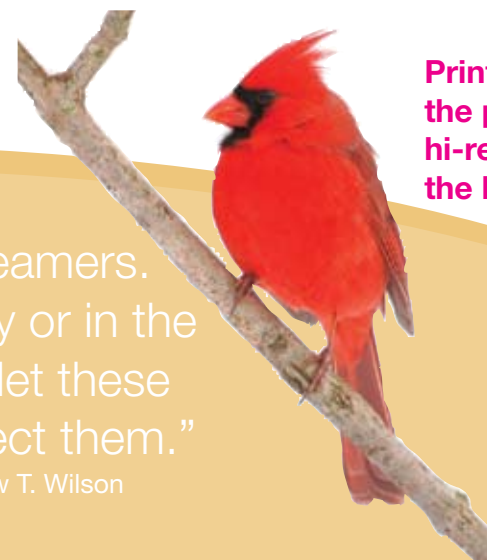

1 The three-season porch (above) will undoubtedly bring great joy to residents. Notice the beautiful windows that will allow them to look out onto busy East Paris Avenue to see what’s happening in the world. There is nothing like a little hustle and bustle to keep one from being bored.

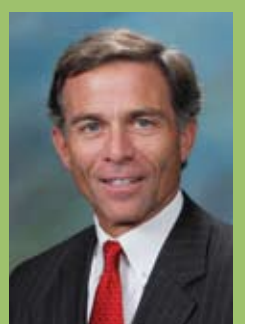

## Charitable Gift Annuities Get More MPG!!!

In this world of higher energy costs and declining stock market values, it is refreshing to find a charitable giving vehicle that acts like a souped up Ford Fusion hybrid or a Toyota Prius. The charitable giving vehicle that operates with such powerful efficiency is a charitable gift annuity and allows for more, “Money Per Gift” or MPG!

### What is a Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA)?

A CGA is created by a donor agreeing to give cash, stock, or other assets to Porter Hills. Porter Hills will, in return, pay the donor a fixed payment, called an annuity, for life. The donor will also be allowed certain tax benefits from the gift. The annuity payments are fixed for the donor’s life. They are calculated based on the age of the donor and are currently fixed at 5.7% for a 70 year old donor, 7.1% for an 80 year old donor and 8.1% for an 85 year old donor. As an example, a \$50,000 CGA for an 80 year old donor would yield them \$1,000 quarterly for the remainder of their life. A portion of the quarterly payment is tax advantaged and the donor would be allowed an income tax deduction for a portion of the initial gift. Also at the death of the donor, Porter Hills would benefit as the legacy of this wonderful gift and the donor has choices as to what area of Porter Hills will be the recipient of the funds. Now that is truly more MPG!

### Is the CGA something new at Porter Hills?

No, these are time tested, well tuned charitable vehicles. As a matter of fact, Porter Hills has been issuing CGA’s since 1993 and has 45 of them currently providing income to various generous benefactors. A CGA can be set-up to provide income not only to the donor but also to a surviving spouse or other named beneficiary.

### How does a donor create a CGA?

The process of creating a CGA is much more simple than shopping for a new hybrid vehicle. You simply contact the Porter Hills Foundation offices and they will review the options available to you for this wonderful opportunity. Just think, you can increase your current income stream along with that of a surviving income beneficiary, if you so choose, and at the same time make a difference in someone’s life at Porter Hills in the future. Definitely more MPG!!!

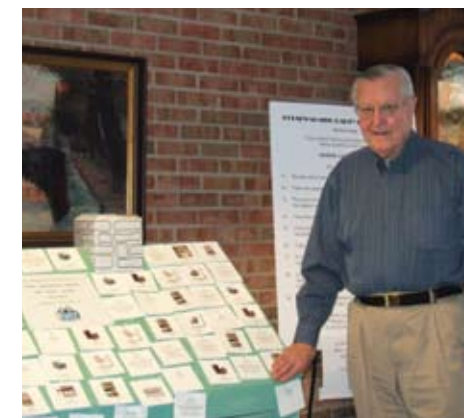
## Porter Hills Foundation Throws Housewarming Party

Dr. Thomas graduated from Harvard Medical School. He presently holds the position of Professor of Aging Studies and Distinguished Fellow at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County's Erickson School in Baltimore, MD.

He is the recipient of a three-year fellowship from the global nonprofit organization Ashoka. He won the America's Award, established by Norman Vincent Peale and sometimes called "The Nobel Prize for Goodness" in 1997. Dr. Thomas has also been honored by the Giraffe Project, which gives awards to people who "stick their neck out" to advance the common good. Most recently, he has been honored with the Heinz Award for Human Condition.

His books, *What Are Old People For? How Elders Will Save the World*, *Learning from Hannah* and *Life Worth Living* explore the concept of the Eden Alternative and its impact on long-term care.
